9:00am – 10:30am	Influenza vaccine research using large linkable databases Keynote Speaker: Dr Jeff Kwong, Senior Scientist, ICES Health administrative data have been used for decades for pharmacoepidemiologic research, but their use for research on vaccine-preventable diseases has generally been more limited. In this talk, I will provide some examples of how we have used linked databases (e.g., laboratory data, health administrative data) in Ontario, Canada to conduct epidemiologic studies on influenza and influenza vaccines.  Innovations for stronger more integrated immunization services in resource-limited settings.  Keynote Speaker: Dr Chris Morgan, Head, International Development Discipline, Burnet Insitute  This presentation will discuss what is needed at the front-line of immunization services in resource-constrained settings from Africa through to Australia's near neighbours in order to strengthen routine programs. It will draw on the lessons learned from the review of progress under WHO's Global Vaccine Action Plan to 2020 and discuss the innovations in service delivery and appropriate technologies that are needed for the next decade. The presentation will highlight the work of Australians in global immunization (including the new Australian Regional Immunization Alliance) and the importance of connections with global partners such as WHO, UNICEF, Gavi, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and PATH.
